education rights now!

In 2007 from January through to June – with the main focus as ever on Global Action Week (23-29th April) – campaigners will be joining up across the world to form the world's longest-ever chain to support the right to Education For All.

The main focus for the 2007 **JOIN UP – Education Rights Now!** Activities will be centred on the concept of 'chains'. These can either be represented through artwork such as **paper cut-outs** or **people joining hands to form a chain**.

There are three global stages that make up the **JOIN UP – Education Rights Now!** challenge:

1. Gather evidence on the right to education
2. Invite officials to participate and join the chain
3. JOIN UP to create the world's largest chain

How to do this:

- Create a paper-chain or,
- Join hands to create a people-chain and take a picture or make a film of this

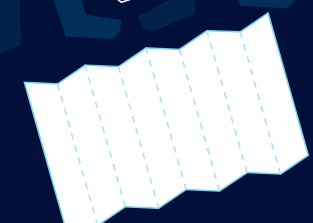
Instructions

If you decide to make paper chains please follow the instructions below:

- 1** Begin by cutting out one of the people templates. Then find a large sheet of paper or make a large piece by taping smaller sheets together.



- 2** Next, accordion-fold the paper as shown in the diagram below. Position the people template with the arm side right against the folded edge of the paper.



- 3** Draw and cut around the people template. Make sure you don't cut through all the folded edge around the hand.



- 4** Open up the folded paper to reveal a cut-out people chain. Think about customising your chain, drawing or painting them in.
